### Eva Feder Kittay – Stony Brook University, USA

Eva Feder Kittay is Distinguished Professor of Philosophy at Stony Brook University/SUNY; a Senior Fellow of the Stony Brook Center for Medical Humanities, Compassionate Care and Bioethics, and an Affiliate of the Women's Studies Program. She does research in Applied Philosophy, Social and Political Philosophy and Ethics. She is the recipient of a Guggenheim Fellowship, an NEH Fellowship, and the APA and Phi Beta Kappa Lebowitz Prize. She has also been recognized for her work in Feminist Philosophy, being named Women Philosopher of the Year (2003-2004) by the Society for Women in Philosophy and having chaired the Committee on the Status of Women (1997-2001). Her book *Love's Labor: Essays on Women, Equality, and Dependency* (Routledge, 1999) has received international attention and has been translated into Japanese and Italian.

### Angela Biancofiore – Université Paul-Valéry, Montpellier 3, France

Angela Biancofiore is Professor of Italian Studies at the University of Montpellier (France). She published several books and articles on Italian Arts and Literature, she founded and runs the web Journal Notos. Espaces de la création : arts, écritures, utopies.

Since 2013 she organizes regularly seminars and conferences on Ecology, Ecocriticism, Arts and contemporary Literature, with particular attention to the Philosophy of Care.





### Malte Brinkmann – Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin, Germany

Malte Brinkmann holds the chair of the Department of General Education/Philosophy und Theory of Education at the Humboldt-University of Berlin. He is a representative of Phenomenological Pedagogy. He works on the topics of Philosophy of Education, Theory and Empirics of Learning, Bildung and Education; on the topic of Practicing in pedagogical contexts and in the field of Classroom- and Videographical Research. Furthermore, he is the editor of a series on Phenomenological Educational Studies and runs a Blog as well as a YouTube channel on General Education/Philosophy of Education. After his PhD at the University of Cologne he worked as a teacher and then in teacher training.
