LORENZO BERNINI: EARLY ACHIEVEMENTS TRACK-RECORD

THE RESEARCH CENTRE POLITE SSE: In April 2012, Lorenzo Bernini founded at the University of Verona the interdisciplinary research centre PoliTeSse – Politics and Theories of Sexuality. PoliTeSse is the first University centre in Italy specifically devoted to Gender Studies and Queer Theories, to the promotion of sexual minorities’ rights, and to the struggle against homophobia and transphobia. Bernini is the centre’s director and in the past five years he has organized about fifty advanced seminars for researchers, post-doctoral fellows and doctoral students and an international conference on the history of sexual minorities in Italy. PoliTeSse established itself from the start as a pole attracting students and researchers not only in Italy but also on the European scale, promoting the internationalization of the University of Verona. At the moment twenty six researchers among philosophers, psychologists, sociologists, historians and anthropologists collaborate with the centre. Thanks to the presence of PoliTeSse, Gender Studies, Cultural Studies and – for the first time in Italy – Queer Theories, made their appearance among the research areas of the PhD programme in Human Sciences. And thanks to the presence of PoliTeSse, the Academic Senate of the University of Verona approved the adoption of the double academic ID for transgender students (in 2014) as well as for teaching and administrative personnel (in 2015). The PI is responsible for the Double Academic ID for transgender students of the whole University.

INTERNATIONAL COLLABORATIONS AND SUPERVISION OF MARIE-CURIE FELLOWSHIPS: Bernini is

responsible for two international research agreements regarding PoliTeSse: with the School of Arts and Humanities of Nottingham Trent University (UK) and with the Centre for Applied Philosophy, Politics and Ethics of the University of Brighton (UK). Furthermore he was the supervisor of PhD student Gianmaria Colpani in co-supervision with Sandra Ponzanesi of the Netherlands Research School of Gender Studies/Graduate Gender Programme, Utrecht University (NL). He also supervises the research of Michela Balocchi and Umberto Grassi, who obtained two Marie Curie scholarship with the projects “INTERSEXIONS” and “SPACES”. He collaborated with Adriana Cavarero for the supervision of Massimo Prearo’s Marie Curie research project “LGBT Act” (328404), and for the supervision of Anna Schober’s Marie Curie research project “PICTURING GENDER” (234990).

PUBLICATIONS: Bernini has at the moment about sixty publications. His book *Apocalissi queer. Elementi di teoria antisociale (Queer Apocalypses. Elements of Antisocial Theory)* is endorsed on the back cover by Adriana Cavarero, one of the most distinguished feminist scholars in the feminist European debate and Lee Edelman, one of the most distinguished scholars in the queer American debate. Cavarero presented the book as “the first Italian work of international reach devoted to queer theories”; Edelman wrote that “*Apocalissi Queer* announces the emergence of a major new voice in the field and contributes valuably to the on-going development and vitality of queer thought.” The book has been translated into Spanish and English. His latest book *Le teorie queer: Un’introduzione (Queer Theories. An Introduction)* is being translated into Spanish.
